## Create a Framed Badge

This exercise is taken from the Frames, Borders and Motifs chapter of the PREMIER+<sup>™</sup> 2 Embroidery Reference Guide for Windows<sup>®</sup>.

Use text and a frame to create a personalized badge, starting with an embroidery.

## **Champion Dad**

Before you start, run Reset All Modules in PREMIER+ $^{10}$  2 Configure  $\frac{1}{100}$  to use the initial settings for PREMIER+ $^{10}$  2 Embroidery.

- 1 In the Quick Access toolbar, click Change Hoop 🚺. In the Hoop Selection dialog box select 180mm x 130mm Universal Large Hoop 1.
- 2 Set Orientation to Natural and click OK.
- In the Quick Access toolbar at the top of the screen, click Insert 🛐.
- **4** Browse to Documents\Premier+2\Samples\Premier+2Emb\Stitch2\Transport.
- 5 Scroll down until you see "Biplane", and click to select it.
- 6 Click Open to load the embroidery into the work area. The embroidery has white handles on its selection box, showing that it is initially in Scale rather than Resize a mode (blue handles).
- 7 Click the Frame tab.
- 8 In Category, ensure that Frames is selected.
- 9 Select the second (round) frame in Applique Shields 1 (the top set in the list).
- 10 In the Stitch Type drop-down menu at the top right, select Appliqué Fabric. The Appliqué Selection dialog box opens.
- 11 Click Load Previously Saved Fabric 👛. The Picture Viewer opens.
- **12** Browse to the folder General\Checkerboard.
- **13** Scroll down and select the fabric Checkers Round 1 18, then click OK. The Picture Viewer will close and the fabric will be shown in the Appliqué Selection dialog box.
- 14 Click OK to close the Appliqué Selection dialog box.
- 15 Ensure that the embroidery is still selected and click Apply **✓** to place the frame around the embroidery.
- **16** In the Color Select on the right, double-click the top color in the list. This is the blue for the frame.
- 17 In the Quick Colors click the dark yellow in row 4 column 7.
- **18** In the Color Selection dialog box keep this gold color, or choose a slightly darker color.
- **19** Click OK to close the Color Selection dialog. The frame border is now a gold color.
- 20 Click the Letter tab.
- 21 In the font gallery on the left, scroll to the Modern font category.
- 22 Select the font Carlton UC 15-45mm.
- 23 Enter the word "Champion" in the Letters text box and press Enter on the keyboard for a new line.





- 24 In the line below enter the word "Dad".
- **25** Set Gap to 10.
- 26 In the Lettering Shape area, click Full Circle 😂.
- 27 In Stitches, ensure that ColorSort is selected (checked).
- 28 Click Apply ✓. The lettering appears around the embroidery. Its handles are green. If the lettering does not surround the embroidery, the embroidery was not selected. Click Undo ☑, click to select the embroidery, then click Apply again.
- **29** Drag the square green handle at the top of the circle of lettering downwards so that it fits well around the framed embroidery.
- **30** In the Quick Access toolbar, click Design Player b to see the embroidery as it will be stitched out.
- 31 Click Cancel to close the Design Player.
- 32 In the Quick Access toolbar, click Save As R and save the embroidery as "Champion Dad". The various parts of this multipart embroidery will be stored separately, making further adjustment easier.



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
